Seen everywhere during celebrations, it symbolises virtue, joy and sincerity.



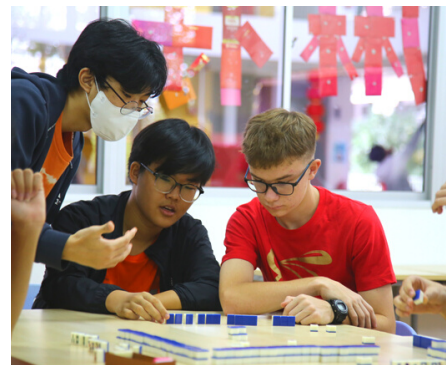
FU
